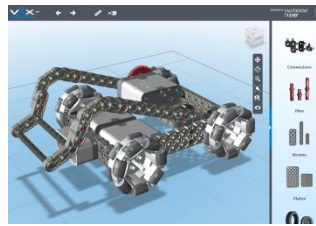
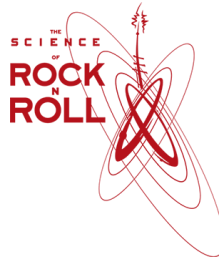

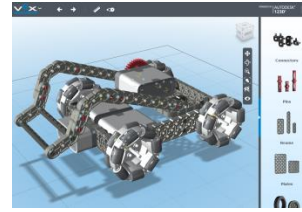

Fee: \$100 for two weeks\*

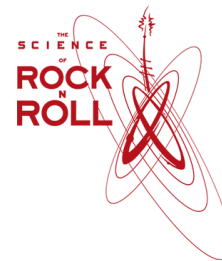


This two-week course is for aspiring makers and tinkerers who wish to build a robot that they can control and take home at the end of the classes. We'll learn and use building skills, problem-solving skills, and coding skills as we create robots that can navigate a challenging course. No particular skills are required, but curiosity and a 'can-do' spirit are a must.

\*This is a two-week course – students attend both weeks so they can leave with a robot.

Our Summer Adventure Course is a one-of-a-kind experience designed to excite, engage, and encourage youth to explore their inner potential through facilitated interactive adventures. This is an active course designed for students who want to learn the basics skills of adventure and experiential education. Students will have an opportunity to climb all of the Project Adventure elements that MRMS has to offer: Cargo Net, Firecracker, Ladder/Rope Ladder, Centipede, Flying Squirrel, Swing Shot, Dangle Duo, Ropes, and Pamper Pole. They will also learn valuable life skills such as setting realistic goals, supporting others, and problem-solving; acquire technical skills like climbing, rappelling, belaying, spotting, and knot-tying; and make friends and build a stronger school community through fun cooperative games and team challenges. Days 1 & 2 will be held at MRMS. On Day 3, students will travel to the Adventure Park at Heritage Museums & Gardens in Sandwich. \*Day 3 pickup will be later. \*\*Fee includes ticket and transportation to The Adventure Park.
